

#### **Vessel Safety Checks (Lt Pat McDonald)**

At the end of February, we had completed 39 VSCs with 34 passing.

The Coast Guard has issued a mandatory 2024 workshop for Vessel Examiners. This online material has been distributed to all Squadron VEs. As mentioned last month, there were changes to the requirements for fire extinguishers (all must have a date of manufacture). There is also a new emphasis on informing boat owners of the means and reason for registering your VHF with the MMSI registry, as this makes any distress calls from your radio much more effective.

Please remember that our website has a list of Squadron Vessel Examiners and a place to sign up for a VSC of your own boat (<u>Vessel Safety Check – Cape Fear Sail & Power Squadron (capefearpowersquadron.org</u>). Let's make sure all of our Squadron's vessels are checked for the coming season.

We have two upcoming VSC events:

Saturday, March 9 - Inlet Watch Yacht Club (9 am to 1 pm): All VEs have been contacted to sign up.

<u>Saturday, March 23 – West Marine (9 am to 1 pm)</u>. We will perform VSCs in the parking lot for trailered boats and paddle craft. Please contact Lt Pat MacDonald if you are available.

The **Piloting/Marine Navigation** class is underway with 18 students. The class is being held at the New Hanover County Arboretum in the NC Extension classroom. The facility is great, and there is plenty of free parking.

The next **America's Boating Course**<sup>®</sup> (ABC) on June 22 will also be held at the NC Extension classroom. Our final ABC class for 2024 will be on August 3.

All 26 students in our February ABC class passed. We had a wonderful teaching cruise on the river on the second day.

## ABC STARTS 2024 AT A NEW VENUE 1/Lt Meg Morrison, JN



Twenty-six students attended and passed our **America's Boating Course**® **(ABC)** on February 24-25. Unfortunately, Cape Fear Community College is no longer allowing us to use their facility. Squadron member Catherine Fort passed along a contact at the Girls Leadership of Wilmington (GLOW) Academy during our search for a new facility, and it worked well as the new location

for the February class.

What makes our ABC class unique is the optional 2-hour teaching cruise in partnership with Wilmington Water Tours. As we traveled down the Cape Fear River and back, our students observed cargo container unloading at the Port of Wilmington and learned how to cross the large wakes from the boat traffic. This was in addition to learning about charts, navigation aids, tides and currents, weather, local resources, and historical and geographical facts of interest.

On **Monday**, **April 22**, we will hear from Captain Tim List, Commander of the Coast Guard Sector North Carolina. Capt. List has over 1,300 personnel under his command and his area of responsibility spans 3,375 nautical miles of inland, river and coastal waterways. We will be implementing a New Member Mentoring Program this spring and will be asking members to volunteer. Mentors will be asked to encourage new members to attend meetings and get involved in one or more of the interest groups. The mentors are expected to stay in contact with the new member for the first six months of their Squadron membership.

Last year, eight Interest Groups were formed and members were asked to indicate the groups they would like to join. As a next step, we are going to email the list of groups to all members and ask you to confirm your interest and/or indicate what other group(s) you may be interested in. We will also ask for two co-chair volunteers from each group who will be responsible for planning and organizing at least two events during the year. If we don't get two volunteers from an interest group, we will remove the group from the list.

Our Squadron continues to do well, and we currently have 185 members. We are the largest squadron in North Carolina and in District 27. We have one new member, Reuel K. Sample, who will be introduced and sworn in at our March meeting. Reuel has extensive boating experience and will be a valuable new member.

## CFS&PS FACILITATES BUCKET LIST WISH 1/Lt Meg Morrison, JN and Captain Jim Sheegog

The Cape Fear Sail & Power Squadron in partnership with Shamrock Sailing Adventures recently brought pure joy to a very special woman. We received a call from a local hospice organization, Lower Cape Fear Life Care. A humble "bucket list" request had arrived, and our Squadron appeared to be just the right nonprofit to find a solution.

Lower Cape Fear Life Care requested an offshore cruise for a remarkable sailing captain who longed for one more sail

on the ocean blue. While our Squadron sailboats were not readily available, a sailboat that had received a courtesy vessel safety examination was eager to assist. We asked Jim Sheegog, a local U.S. Coast Guard licensed captain, if he could arrange a day sailing adventure on the Atlantic Ocean. Jim, the owner of Shamrock Sailing Adventures, welcomed the idea, offering his classic 1977 Sparkman & Stephens 42-foot Allied yawl to fulfill the request.

On the afternoon of February 25 *SW/Shamrock* headed out to sea with three very special guests—a retired woman with a request to revisit her sea captain years; her loving husband; and her Lower Cape Fear Life Care healthcare nurse. With light but steady winds and mild temperatures, the sailing vessel made its way into the Atlantic on an incoming tide. Several miles offshore, a dozen playful dolphins swam with the sailboat, breaching several times as if to say "hello." Jim loves the accidental conversations that emerge when the jib and mainsail take over and the auxiliary engine shuts down and the conversation begins. His special guest revealed she was a former transatlantic sea captain. She was also a member of Jim's graduating class of 1973 at Jacksonville Senior High School. As most cockpit conversations go, her life story was just amazing—being the first woman to graduate from Cape Fear Community College's boat building program, and going on to work at Westsail Yachts, formerly of Wilmington.
